In essence, Archivists preserve the past for the present and future generations of learners, researchers, and the general public. Apart from this, Archivists liaise with donors and depositors of archives and maintain computer-aided search systems.
- 12. Curator:-Curators take on a managerial role in museums, art galleries, or heritage centers. They develop collections of valuable exhibits such as artworks, paintings, sculptures, scriptures, etc. Curators organize events like exhibitions, conferences, and audio-visual presentations to display their collections. They buy, exhibit, negotiate the prices of objects, arrange for restoration of artifacts, maintain records and catalog acquisitions, and raise funds and grants for museums/art galleries.
- 13. Archeologist: Archaeologists study human civilizations to find out how they impacted the present world. 6. Government Affairs Director

As the name suggests, Government Affairs Directors supervise and direct public relations team and manage policies related to local, state, and central government matters. They build and maintain beneficial relationships with relevant government agencies, committees, and legislative bodies.

They design corporate policies, strategies, and plans as per government laws and regulations. They examine how the new and updated government regulations affect businesses and offer befitting suggestions to help the company navigate through the changes.

7. Political Consultant

Political Consultants have extensive knowledge of the political process. Their primary responsibility is to devise effective political strategies and campaigns for electoral candidates to influence voters and gain support from the majority. Political Consultants also create favorable stories about political candidates to paint them in a positive light and influence their media image. Sometimes, they also conduct surveys to understand the inclinations and reactions of voters towards political candidates.

8. Public Relations Specialist

Public Relations Specialists handle the responsibility for maintaining and improving the reputation of a company or an organization. Their job is mainly media-centric. Thus, they work closely with media agencies and journalists to place favorable news and stories about their clients before the common mass. Public Relations Specialists draft press releases, write blog posts, manage social media accounts, and organize press conferences and other events to attract media attention and promote their client. They are master negotiators and orators who are always up to date with the industry's current affairs, policies, and laws.

4. Political Anyalist

Political Scientists focus on studying the origin, development, and operation of political systems around the world. They also learn and research political ideas and policies, political trends, and analyze governments. Their research usually pertains to the four core areas – political theory, national politics, comparative politics, and international relations. While Political Scientists use qualitative methods to gather information from disparate sources, they use different quantitative methods to develop political theories. Political Scientists may sometimes do the role of a Policy Analyst for organizations with labor unions and political groups.

9. Intelligence Analyst

Intelligence Analysts are employed by high-level government intelligence agencies like the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), Department of Criminal Intelligence, Directorate of Military Intelligence, Defence Intelligence Agency, Indian Political Intelligence Office, and National Investigation Agency, to name a few. They closely study the behavior and actions of particular groups that are considered security threats, analyze leadership patterns in such groups, and gather information from multiple sources. Intelligence Analysts present their findings in detailed reports and brief to agency executive and political leaders.

10. Policy Analyst

Policy Analysts are primarily responsible for changing, adjusting, and implementing new public policies, laws, and regulations. They may either work under a government or for NGOs and for-profit companies. Policy Analysts policy design a sound thesis and compelling draft arguments for/against adopting a particular policy or law. They may specialize in specific areas (corporate policy, public policy, energy policy, etc.), or they may focus on a government or organization's general political functions.

1. Archeology

Archaeology is a highly research-oriented field of study. Archaeologists are experts who investigate the different facets of human, cultural, and material development. They excavate and unearth things of historical importance like coins, inscriptions, monuments, etc., and analyze them to find out which period they belong to, their purpose, how they were used, and so on. The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is responsible for maintaining heritage buildings, museums, sites, and historical research institutions. So, for an aspiring Archeologist, ASI is the ideal employment institution.

2. Museology

As the name suggests, Museology refers to the study of museums. A Museologist studies and investigates the History of museums, their societal importance, and the activities they propagated. This branch of study will teachyou how to curate and preserve a museum. Furthermore, Museologists perform detailed documentation work concerning artifacts and museum management. They work in museums, heritage galleries, and also in various nongovernmental organizations.

3. Academia

This is undoubtedly one of the most respectable jobs. As a History teacher, you can work in schools, colleges, universities, and online learning institutions. A B.Ed degreeis necessary for the school level, whereas for colleges/universities, you must pass the UGC NET exam.

4. Research

Research is another excellent fit for History graduates. As a researcher, you will learn to understand pastcivilizations and societies' History by studying, examining, and interpreting evidence (texts, pictures, paintings,maps, physical remains of historical sites, etc.).

Researchers find well-paying jobs in historical research organizations like the Indian Council of Social SciencesResearch (ICSSR) and the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR).

5. Civil Services

History makes up a crucial part of the prelims and main exams of the Indian Civil Services. Naturally, ifyou are a History major, you will possess in-depth knowledge of Historical events, dates, and concepts. This will be a significant help when you appear for the Civil Services exams. If you clear the Civil Services exams, you will join the ranks of the most prestigious and respectable officers in the country.

6. Historian

Historians are academics, and researchers rolled into one. They mainly deal with studying the events of thepast. Historians research, analyzes, and interprets historical events and write their inferences about them. They collect data from libraries, archives, and artifacts, determining the authenticity and importance of historical data, translate historical documents into human languages, preserve artifacts and documents in museums, and publish their writings in academic journals.

7. Archivist

Archivists are primarily responsible for acquiring, curating, and managing a permanent

collection ofdocuments, artifacts, other materials of historical and cultural importance. Their archive generally includes historicbooks, papers, maps, photographs, prints, films, videotapes, and computer-generated records. In essence, Archivists preserve the past for the present and future generations of learners, researchers, and the general public. Apart from this, Archivists liaise with donors and depositors of archives and maintain computer-aided search systems.

8. Curator

Curators take on a managerial role in museums, art galleries, or heritage centers. They develop collections of valuable exhibits such as artworks, paintings, sculptures, scriptures, etc. Curators organize events like exhibitions, conferences, and audio-visual presentations to display their collections. They buy, exhibit, negotiate the prices of objects, arrange for restoration of artifacts, maintain records and catalog acquisitions, and raise funds and grants for museums/art galleries.

9. Archeologist

Archaeologists study human civilizations to find out how they impacted the present world. They inspectand examining historical artifacts, ranging from prehistoric tools and objects to monuments and buildings. 1. Cartographers

Cartographers create maps for a living. Today, cartographers don't just rely on their owndrawing skills but instead use technological innovations like digital mapping software to producemore accurate maps. Town Planning, BhumiAbhilekh, PWD, B& C Departments.Cartography is art and science of graphically representing a Geographical area, usually on a flat surface such as map or charts.

2. Tourist Guide:

With the help of basic Geographical knowledgeof tourist places in different state, Students gets employability as tourist guide at different places in different state and countries. Tourist guides are members of the hospitality and travel industry who show visitors around places of interest. Tour guide may lead groups or individual through historical sites, Museums, Geographical Destination and on outdoor excursions. The Indian institute of tourism and travel management conducts guide training on behalf of the ministry of tourism. Being a tourism guide is one of themost rewarding jobs in the world.

3. Demographer:

Demography is the study and practice of the collecting analysing and presenting data thathas a Geographic or Areal dimension such as Census of demographic data. Data collected using GPStechnology in the field can be mapped onto digital maps and globes or viewed and analyzed in GIS.

4. Geography Teachers

A geography teacher at the postsecondary level may work for a community college, degree college or university. Depending on their work environment, geography teachers may conduct their own research in addition to educating geography majors and students in other programs of study.

5. Land Surveyors

For students who are primarily interested in the physical features of geographic locations and the technology used to gather and analyze geographical data, land surveyor is a surprisingly high-paying path to consider. The role of a land surveyor is to make the precise measurements needed to establish the boundaries of properties to be used for engineering and construction projects and acquire information about the contour and shape of the properties' surface. Land surveyor jobs may involve a considerable amount of fieldwork. These professionals often work outdoors in less-than-ideal weather and perform physically demanding work, including carrying heavy equipment and walking long distances and for extended periods of time.

6. Geographers

Some geography graduates go on to become, simply geographers. Geographers are scientists who study either the natural environment (physical geography) or human interactions withthe environment (human geography) and prepare reports on their findings.

7. GIS Developer

Geographical information systems technology is necessary not only for the scientific study of geography but also for just about every field related to it, from land surveying andenvironmental planning to emergency management. If the technical services side of

the field is whatmost interests you, a career as a GIS developer may be in your future. GIS Developers are theprofessionals who design and program GIS computer software applications.

8. Urban Planners

Having an undergraduate degree in geography can help both urban and regional plannersdo the work to create communities that thrive. An urban planner focuses specifically on urbanexpansion development, while regional planners may develop plans for areas on a broader scale interms of distance, population and type of area (urban, suburban or rural).

9. Remote Sensing Analyst

Remote sensing analyst is another career in the specialization of geographic technology. The geographical information systems technology that is so important in the field of geography andin related efforts relies upon data. Remote sensing technology, the use of satellites and aircraft tocollect images, is one method of acquiring this data. They do more than just consider compliance with existing legislation, instead drawingupon their expertise in environmental geology and science and their skills in the use of geological technologies to advise organizations on the likely environmental consequences of their policies or projects.

11. Economic Geographers

This career draws on the social science side of geography. Economic geographers studyeconomic conditions, patterns and problems through the lens of how place affects economics. Tradepatterns across regions and among countries, the ways different areas exploit their natural resourcesfor economic gain and how economic markets perform across different geographic areas are allpotential areas of interest for economic geographers.

12. Geopolitical Analysts

Geopolitical analysts and geopolitical consultants are scholars of the political systems, movements, trends and events of different areas.
